Storm Catch GPT CLEANING & MAINTENANCE GUIDE







In order to continuously get the best results from the SQID (inner basket of the Storm Catch GPT) there is a small amount of maintenance required.

For the smaller devices, they can be removed manually, emptied and cleaned. Follow the steps below to clean out the SQID's by hand.

MANUALLY CLEANING

- 1. Remove the grate from on top of the pit. Lift the SQID out of the pit using the handles provided (on the models where these are present) or by pulling from the edges at the top of the SQID.
- 2. Tip out the contents of the SQID and appropriately dispose of to ensure the rubbish will not end up back in the pit/waterway.
- 3. Rinse out the SQID to get rid of any small particles that may have built up and clog the mesh filters.
- 4. Place the SQID back in the grate, ensure it is sitting flat and secure before placing the grate back on top.

For larger devices, depending on how heavy and accessible they are, these can either be manually cleaned out or with a road sweeper, operated by road service crews.

It is recommended that after any significant weather event, that the SQID device be emptied. There is an overflow mechanism that does allow the SQID to function when it is at full capacity and 100% blocked, but this shouldn't be relied on for regular use.
